New Governor, Democrat John Bel Edwards.

At this time the new administration is working on huge budget deficit left by Bobby Jindal's administration. In speaking with Department of Health & Hospitals, no major cuts are expected to their budget this year for Pinecrest (the last State-run ICF). This ICF is to be fully funded until 2017 but, we are told 2017 could see some challenges.

Department of Labor mandates regarding overtime rules for hourly and salaried employees has become a real issue as Louisiana struggles with budget shortfalls. EVERYTHING is being looked at in all departments.

If the new budget being hammered out right now does not produce the funding needed for necessary services, a 2nd Special Session may be called to deal with the financial shortfall.

The population at our last State-run ICF, has changed to include some patients with mental illness, which is a concern for all parents. We have heard on TV, advocates are working to get funding to open new facilities to handle this issue.

Officials in Baton Rouge tell us Governor Edwards does not support Managed Care, so that is put on hold for now.

Resource Centers which used to be provided by the State-run ICF's have now been moved completely off all campuses as the closure of a previous State-run ICF is being completed. (The Hammond facility was privatized in 2012 with the agreement mandating closure in 5 years by the private provider taking it over. It will be closed by September 30, 2016 – a full year earlier than expected due to budget constraints.) Resource Centers are now consolidated into two hubs (Hammond and Alexandria) with workers in different areas moved to telework status.
